EAGLE SCOUT PROJECTS FOR 2005

-A key objective of an Eagle Project is to provide service to School, Community or Church, and to show leadership. In each of these projects summarized, the services of many Scouts (and maybe a few adults) under the leadership of the Eagle Candidate were involved.

- 1. Project involved the construction of a nature center at St. Marie Goretti Church in Hatfield.**
- 2. Project consisted of the collection and retiring of 850 flags at the Legion Post 206 in Lansdale.**
- 3. Project involved the construction of a garden and retaining wall around a sign at the entrance to School Road Park on Hatfield Township.**
- 4. Project involved the restoration of a barn at the Morgan House in Towamencin Township and included building shelving units and basic cabinets and storage bins, construction of a moveable dolly for an antique cider press, repair and organizing yard tools and doing an inventory of the barn's contents.**
- 5. Project consisted of planting a garden at the Advent Lutheran Church in Harleysville and involved planning the plot, tilling, mulching, planting and completing the garden with two benches.**
- 6. Project involved the replacement of the saggy springs on 14 metal cots with plywood at the Indian Housing Corporation in Souderton, which are used for their Interfaith Hospitality Network. Three sections of plywood, so they could be folded, were bolted to the metal frames.**
- 7. Project consisted of the clean up and painting of a water house on the property of Mary Mother of the Redeemer Church in Lansdale.**
- 8. Project involved the development of an outdoor classroom, involving site preparation and constructing benches for 50 students, at the Hatfield Township Nature Center for the instruction of nature topics.**
- 9. Project involved the clearing and mulching of overgrown trails and also the construction of a paver base for vending machines in School Road Park in Hatfield Township.**
- 10. Project involved the removal of old paint, resealing and then painting a shed at the Morgan Log House in Towamencin Township.**
- 11. Project involved the construction of a platform around a kiosk in the Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy in Schwenksville, and also building a bench in back of platform.**
- 12. Project consisted of necessary renovations at Fairview Village Church of the Nazarene in Fairview Village and involved preparing and repainting areas of the café and also moving topsoil to various planting areas around the church.**

- 13. Project involved the cleaning and placing of circular labels (indicating No Dumping/drains to creek) on 450 storm drains in Montgomery Township around Upper State Road, and also included handing out informative pamphlets to neighbors.**
- 14. Project consisted of painting about 100 house numbers on curbs, after getting permission from home owners, in the Clover Crest area in Upper Gwynedd Township, North Wales.**
- 15. Project involved the straightening of grave stones at the Christ reformed Church at Indian Creek, as well as reseeding areas around these stones.**
- 16. Project involved the landscaping and the construction of fencing around the perimeter of a parking lot at the new Schweiker Park on Moyer Road in Lansdale.**
- 17. Project involved power washing and then weather proofing benches and tables at the Sebastian Riding Associates, which provides therapeutic horseback riding for children with disabilities. A garden bordered by railroad ties was also constructed and various plants added.**
- 18. Project involved the constructing a planting area and planting various plants in front of the parking lot at Schweiker Park in Hatfield Township.**
- 19. Project involved refurbishing of the exterior of the Souderton Youth Football Association Snack Bar at Franconia Community Park, and included painting and staining the exterior as well as cleaning and replacing broken or dirty parts.**
- 20. Project consisted in the building of two gardens in the existing greenhouse at the Variety Club Camp in Worcester, with one at ground level and the other raised 2 ½ feet above ground for easy access by wheelchair-bound children**
- 21 Project involved the building of five benches for placement around the memorial stone and other places in Charles L. Reed Memorial Park in Harleysville.**
- 22. Project involved the water sealing of the large wooden pavilion at Reed Park in Harleysville.**
- 23. Project involved the clean up of trash and the planting of 107 trees and bushes to prevent erosion along the Wissahickon Creek in the Wissahickon Watershed area.**
- 24. Project involved he building and placement of fourteen bird houses and the refurbishing of informational signs at Franconia Park in Franconia Township.**
- 25. Project consisted of landscaping a plot of ground around a handicapped accessible port-a-potty, and improving access to it, in School Road Park in Hatfield Township.**
- 26. Project involved the removal of a rotted stockade type fence around a storage area adjacent to a shed, removal of debris and then rebuilding and painting it, and retaining its historical accuracy, at the Morgan Log House Museum in Towamencin Township,**
- 27. Project consisted of the construction of a sand volleyball court at the Upper Salford Township Park.**

- 28. Project involved the building and placement of ten cedar nest boxes (for blue birds), and also the planting of shrubs around each pole for box, at the Variety Club Camp in Worcester.**
- 29. Project involved the painting of three bathrooms at the Advent Lutheran Church of Old Goshenhoppen in Harleysville. The painting was not just solid colors, but included hand painted murals of forests and clouds.**
- 30. Project involved the construction of fourteen picnic tables for Reed Park in Lower Salford Township.**
- 31. Project involved building a large plant bed framed with stone on one side of the carriage house, and then researching native plants, which were then planted, at the Williams-Kindig House, built in 1732, in Hatfield Township.**
- 32. Project involved the removal of temporary shelves and then construction of permanent shelving for food supplies, and also preparing an area for a vegetable garden, at Christ Lutheran Church in Kulpsville.**
- 33. Project involved the collection of 466 American flags and then setting up a proper flag retirement ceremony with the Hatfield American Legion Post 933 in Hatfield.**
- 34. Project involved laying down brickwork, using about 900 bricks, around the Officer Reed Memorial in Charles L. Reed Memorial Park in Harleysville.**

EAGLE SCOUT PROJECTS FOR 2006

1. Eagle Project involved the construction of two garden beds, planting flowers and shrubs and installing new signs at the new Stratford Park in Hatfield.
2. Eagle Project involved the planting of eight 10' tall trees at the Spring Valley Park in Montgomery Township, as well as cleaning up considerable trash along the park access road.
3. Eagle Project involved the placement of anchors and then paver stones underneath three picnic tables in Clemens Park in Hatfield Township.
4. Eagle Project involved the design and supervision of the construction of a garden wall around a gazebo at the Little Zion Lutheran Church in Telford.
5. Eagle Project involved the repainting of the pavilion and a nearby utility shed at Parkside Place in Upper Gwynedd township.
6. Eagle Project involved the removal of 27 cubic yards of sand and replacing it with top soil and seed and also painting 800 ft. of fencing along the pool perimeter at the Nor-Gwyn pool at Parkside Place in North Wales.

8. Eagle Project involved the building of a mounting ramp to help children in wheelchairs to reach horse-level to mount a horse at the Sebastian Riding Association in Collegeville.
9. Eagle Project involved planning and installation of an indoor rock climbing wall at Barth Elementary School in Pottstown.
10. Eagle Project involved the installation of 13 parking bollards, removing brush and debris behind a snack bar and replacement of wood on three picnic tables at Schweiker Park in Hatfield Township.
11. Eagle Project involved the building and placement of eight blue bird houses for the Audubon Society in Ivyland, PA.
12. Eagle Project involved the collection of 43 wheelchairs and other assistive devices, such as walkers, canes and crutches, to be delivered to the needy in developing nations via "The Mobility Project", a Christian non-profit organization.
13. Eagle Project involved the recruiting, training and organizations of 120 North Penn High School students to be guides for the National Association of Student Councils National Conference, held at NPHC in June 2006.

-A key objective of an Eagle Project is to provide service to School, Community or Church, and to show leadership. In each of these projects summarized, the services of many Scouts, friends and maybe a few adults under the leadership of the Eagle Candidate were involved.

- 1. Project involved the upgrading of the softball field at the Christ United Methodist Church in Lansdale, PA., including adding and leveling a special soil mix, lengthening base positions to regulation size, replacing base pads and upgrading benches.**
- 2. Project involved the cleaning out of two large old fountains, clearing the area around them of many years of growth and the construction of two benches at St. Mary's Villa in Ambler, PA.**
- 3. Project involved the building of a large display board (with roof) and also a paver path/walkway to an outdoor bathroom at the Summit Avenue Park in Telford.**
- 4. Project involved the removal, and then replacement, of an old split rail fence, major clean up of the area and reconstruction of a gate leading to a deck at the Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy in Schwenksville, PA.**
- 5. Project involved the installation of protective posts between the baseball bleachers and a road at the Hatfield Community Park baseball field.**
- 6. Project involved the removal of old siding from a building (Annex #1) and replacing it with new vinyl siding at the Bethany Bible Fellowship Church in Hatfield.**
- 7. Project consisted of assembling eight benches and installing them at the Stratford Park in Hatfield, and included a locking device for each and the placement of recycled asphalt around the benches.**
- 8. Project involved the construction of a fence (6 feet high) to hide a concrete wall and also build three picnic benches at the Nor-Gwyn baseball field.**
- 9. Project involved the removal of nonnative growth on two large mounds, removal of the mounds (to improve water flow in area) and then planting grass seed at the Hatfield Nature area in Hatfield Township.**
- 10. Project involved the creation of a DVD with video and discussions of each of the various activities conducted at St. John's Lutheran Church in Sumneytown, PA to show to prospective and new members of the church.**
- 11. Project involved the power washing and then staining and/or painting the stair railings, deck and columns on a porch at the Jerusalem Lutheran Church in Schwenksville, PA.**
- 12. Project involved the upgrading of a drop-off building for donations for various programs and involved replacing old doors and windows and adding shelves to hold donations at Christ Lutheran Church in Kulpsville, PA.**

28. Project involved the construction of a campfire area, including building of six benches, at the Christ United Church of Christ in Harleysville, PA.

- 1. Project involved rebuilding a deteriorated 15' long foot bridge in Montgomery Township's Autumn Woods Park after dismantling the old bridge.**
- 2. Project involved the repair and renovation of twenty sets of recreational little league baseball field bleachers, involving replacing bad boards and painting everything, located around the fields at Hatfield Elementary School.**
- 3. Project involved removing 340' of a split rail fence and stacking the wood, digging a shallow ditch around the sides of the church and adding stone to prevent splashing of mud on the walls with rains and a major cleanup of the area and removal of unwanted vines and shrubs at the Salford Schwenkfelder Church.**
- 4. Project involved the collecting of 775 coats for distribution to disadvantaged children and adults in the Philadelphia area in conjunction with The Greater Philadelphia Cares Volunteer Organization and St. Vincent DePaul's Society.**
- 5. Project involved the building of a horse shed for therapeutic horses at the Ivy Therapeutic Equestrian Riding Center in Perkasi, PA.**
- 6. Project involved the removal of extensive vines, weeds and small Sumac trees that were infringing on the perimeter and choking out 20 large Hemlock trees at the Central Schwenkfelder Church in Worcester, PA.**
- 7. Project consisted of replacing rails on an old fence, repainting a merry-go-round, repainting a guard rail and adding wood chips to several areas at West Point Park.**
- 8. Project involved constructing two fixed flower beds on each side of the Grist Mill Park in Towamencin Township.**
- 9. Project involved the building of a youth worship area, which included constructing five benches, a large cross and a fire pit at the Zwingli UCC in Souderton, PA.**
- 10. Project involved the priming and painting the downstairs walls, as well as putting non-slip tape on stairs, at Manna on Main Street in Lansdale.**
- 11. Project involved the construction of a 30' long, 3' wide handicapped ramp with handrails and going from ground level to the porch connected to the parsonage at the Burton Fork Baptist Church in Bennettsville, SC.**
- 12. Project involved the construction of a walking trail, planting of trees, stream bed cleanup and wildlife habitat enhancements at the Peter Wenz Farmstead in Worcester, PA.**
- 13. Project involved the collection of 3118 books to be presented to New Life and Family Services in Schwenksville and the Indian Valley YMCA in Harleysville, PA.**

- 14. Project involved trash cleanup, repairing a broken balance beam, cleaning up and relining a basketball court and replacing vandalized park signs in the Autumn Fitness Trail area in Montgomery Township.**
- 15. Project involved the replacement and painting of rotted and broken siding on four baseball dugouts at Bustard Park in Towamencin Township.**
- 16. Eagle Project involved improving the baseball field at Central Schwenkfelder Church in Worcester, PA. and consisted of building new spectator seating, renovating the player bench area and staining existing and new benches.**
- 17. Project involved the repair or renovation of six dugouts, four needing replacements of roofs, at the baseball fields for the Lansdale Parks and Recreational Department areas on Moyer Road.**
- 18. Project involved cleaning up of the loft area of old/unsafe materials, building a work bench to finish set pieces and building shelves to hold theater props and other items at the North Penn High School Theatre Wood Loft.**
- 19. Project involved the preparation of a video showing the little things we can do to make our environment a better place. It included several themes and video scenes using different location. The video will be used by the North Penn High School and will be shown via the Health Department.**
- 20. Project consisted constructing a ~50' bridge with railings over a creek in Knapp Park in Montgomery County, as well as laying down 60' of wood chips leading to the bridge.**
- 21. Project involved replacing the cedar shake roof on a 19th century wash shed at the Bergey Mill Farmstead in Lower Salford Township.**
- 22. Project involved the design and building of a 24' bridge/boardwalk at the Hatfield Township Nature area.**
- 23. Project involved the placement of six light posts along a path running from the church to a parking lot at the Lenape Valley Presbyterian Church in New Briton.**
- 24. Project consisted of cladding the existing fascia and apron with vinyl-coated aluminum and install soffit to a 156 foot long segment of the Lenape Valley Presbyterian Church's front exterior in New Britain.**
- 25. Project involved remodeling a large flowerbed, removing trash from an acre of land, building three bookshelves and building nine birdhouses at the North Penn High School Environmental Study Area.**
- 26. Project involved the building of a fence and compost bin in a 30'x80' area to improve a native plant nursery area at the Schuylkill Center for Environmental Education in Philadelphia.**
- 27. Project involved the removal 1265' of old abandoned farm fencing and removal of invasive plants in a section of Windlestrae Park in Montgomery Township known as the "Zehr Tract".**
- 28. Project involved installing a 28' long with a 21' branch stone paver walkway, putting stone beds around three picnic tables, sanding and refinishing the tables, planting five tree, installing a sign and mulching the 4,148 sq. ft. playground area at Stover Park in Telford Park.**
- 29. Project involved building benches in an outdoor classroom area for 50 people, redesign a substantial map-sign for the trail system and trail maintenance at the Hatfield Township Nature Area.**

EAGLE SCOUT PROJECTS FROM 2009

A key objective of an Eagle Project is to provide service to School, Community or Church, and to show leadership. In each of these projects summarized, the services of many Scouts, friends and adults under the leadership of the Eagle Candidate were involved. There is no minimum time requirement for projects, but they must be substantial. It is significant that all of these projects involved a total of 5680 service hours for our community.

1. Project involved the construction of six benches at the Morgan Log House in Towamencin Township. The project involved 94 man hours
2. Project involved the construction of a twelve foot in diameter gazebo, including benches on the inside, at Chestnut Grove Park in Franconia Township. The project involved 313 man hours.
3. Project involved the painting of a dining room ceiling and building shelves in the basement at Manna on Main Street in Lansdale. The project required 80 man hours.
4. Project involved the removal of old shelves in a section of the basement at Mann on Main Street and designing and building new ones. The project involved 93 man hours.
5. Project involved the laying out of a twenty station orienteering course at an old farm adjacent to the Enos Godshall Park in Franconia Township. Position markers were constructed for each station and map points for several courses were prepared via a handheld GPS system. Course sheets were also prepared. The project involved 65 man hours.
6. Project involved the assembly of 100 Personal Fire Aid Kits to give to families displaced after a fire and placed at four firehouses in Hilltown, Hatfield, Fairmount and North Penn areas. His project involved 155 man hours.
7. Project consisted of planning and organizing a recycling day and an open house at the Souderton Fire House to educate the public on the operation of the fire company. His project involved 70 man hours.
8. Project involved the construction of a large wigwam structure and involved constructing a sapling frame and then covering it with sheets of bark. It replaced a similar old structure which was falling apart in a Lenape demonstration program area at Green Lane Park. His project involved 203 man hours.
9. Project involved the installation of wheels and draw cords to 50 bins for recyclable materials to make it easier to move them to the curb for pick up at the over fifty-five community at Mill Run in Upper Gwynedd Township. His project involved 222 man hours.
10. Project involved the cleaning, organizing and cataloging of various materials, installing three shelves and building a storage locker in an area used by youth groups in the basement of Lansdale United Methodist Church. His project involved 62 man hours.
11. Project involved the design and installation of fourteen outdoor Stations of the Cross at Saint Maria Goretti Church in Hatfield. His project involved 262 man hours.
12. Project involved the collection of bed sheets, hand towels, bath towels and wash cloths valued at over \$7,500 for the children at St. Mary's Villa for children in Ambler. His project involved 69 man hours.
13. Project involved collecting lost and found items from local schools, cleaning and sorting them and then distributing them to local charities in the North Penn area. His project involved 207 man hours.

14. Project involved the design and construction of 30+ bat boxes which were given to area residents and also hung in area parks to help control the mosquito populations in the Hatfield Township area. His project involved 130 man hours.
15. Project involved the preparation and freezing 150 full dinners for donation to the Aid for Friends branch of Corpus Christi Parish for distribution to people who cannot leave their homes to do grocery shopping. His project involved 80 man hours.
16. Project involved clearing out wood and underbrush and constructing and installing three benches along a trail in Autumn Woods Fitness Trail Park in Montgomery Township. His project involved 120 man hours.
17. Project involved the repair and painting of a storage barn and adjacent fence at the Morgan Log House in Towamencin Township. His project involved 70 man hours.
18. Project involved the collection of over 350 toys and delivery to the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia for children that are ill and also for playrooms needing toys for patients. His project involved 125 man hours,
19. Project involved the construction of a path and a woodland garden pond at Peace Valley Park Nature Center. His project involved 80 man hours.
20. Project involved the construction of several fences around the baseball area at Hosteley Stadium, next to Pennbrook Middle School, in North Wales. His project involved 244 man hours.
21. Project involved the refinishing of six laboratory tables in the school laboratory at St. Stanislaus Parish School in Lansdale. His project involved 164 man hours.
22. Project involved the design and setup of an Ultimate Frisbee Tournament at Gwynedd Square Elementary School with the admission being in the form of canned food or juice for donation to Mann on Main Street. 542 Items were donated. The project involved 375 man hours.
23. Project involved the placing of about 200 18" galvanized steel garden stakes to replace old plastic identifier tags with signs containing the scientific, common name, native and habitat and family at trees and large shrubs in the Hatfield Arboretum In Hatfield Township.
